Congratulations on being part of Wortham's continuous growing choir and extracurricular performance program!

The following information is provided to help us all work together to produce excellence in these music programs at Wortham ISD. Please take time to read it carefully with your family. Addendums will be posted at later dates.

#### **REHEARSALS**

#### Wortham Show Choir (3rd-6th grade)

Auditions for this ensemble will be held in August and early September. Each student will perform one selection in their range memorized and be able to match pitches to certain criteria. Stage presence, movement, vocal projection and energy are required to be accepted.

Rehearsals will be on Monday and Wednesday mornings from 6:45-7:30am and begin the week after audition results are announced. Students should report directly to their homerooms after the bell rings to begin school.

#### North Texas Children's Choir (4\*-6\* grade)

Auditions for 13 available permanent slots and five traveler alternates in the North Texas Children's Choir will take place the day of Show Choir Auditions. Both groups will meet together to learn the rigorous repertoire as well as a Christmas concert program for presentation. A clear voice, an attention to diction and vocal clarity, and singing harmony with the director will be part of the criteria for acceptance. For the 2014-2015 school year, thirteen permanent members and five alternates will be selected to learn the selections scheduled for the annual choral performance at the Meyerson in January. Two during-school rehearsals will be scheduled annually in Plano to be announced later.

Weekly rehearsals will be with the show choir on Mondays and Wednesdays 6:45-7:30am. Attendance and proper choir behavior is expected to continue participation.

An immediate fee of \$40 (\$10 music packet that will be donated back to the school library after concert and \$30 for shirt, lunch, etc. for concert day). \$60 will be required for deposit into the Choir Boosters account by each selected NTCC member for expenses if designated fundraiser is opted out for trip expenses.

The NTCC Satellite choir will perform with alternates the Thursday prior to the Dallas field trip for the community as their fund-raising activity for hotel and meal expenses.

#### Rockin' Recorders (3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup>)

This group is an extracurricular instrumental ensemble whose goal is the individual and ensemble advancement with a performance emphasis on recorder. Meeting before school on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:45-7:30am and at special times of the year, this group travels to compete, perform, and study to increase their knowledge of the woodwind solo and ensemble arts. Members of this group must be a student signed up for music classes in school during the day. 3<sup>rd</sup> grade instruction will b begin in class the first semester. Those wishing to become part of the Rockin' Recorders must attain adequate proficiency and begin with permission from the director.

Individuals may enroll to participate in annual festival competitions on memorized selections. Some Saturdays will apply.

#### Texas Federation of Music Clubs Junior Festivals (3rd-12th Grades)

**Vocal Involvement** – All students may request selections to advance in points toward a gold cup in the TFMC with an enrollment fee of \$15 for each individual event in February. These selections may be in the Musical Theater or Art Song or Patriotic/Folk Song categories for this annual event. Students receiving a Superior rating at the district level held in Waco may advance and participate on the state level held in San Marcos for All-State Ratings.

**Instrumental Involvement** – Open to all piano and recorder students who can memorize selections designated through the TFMC Jr. Festivals Bulletin guidelines. State level requirements and information reflect the vocal qualifications above

(Students participating 3 years and receiving 15 points qualify for a Gold Cup awarded by TFMC). State level winners work to become All-State Winners in their classification in each event.

Special and individual coaching and accompaniment rehearsals may require accompanist fees to participate.

#### 6th-8th Grade UIL Honors Choir/Jr. High Choir Class

The 6°, 7° and 8° grade students who have enrolled in the fine arts elective for choir will automatically be included in the UIL Non-Varsity High School performance choir of Wortham ISD. In this class, members will specialize in the vocal development skills, sightreading skills, study repertoire for region and state honor choirs, and be part of two community performance concerts throughout the year.

Students who are part of the band ensemble will not be able to meet during the school hours as above, but will be required to attend two afterschool rehearsals to participate for sectionals to be part. Attendance monitoring will be strict, and failing grades will not enable the student to participate and follow the "no pass, no play" rule in the Wortham ISD Handbook.

The Extracurricular Jr. High group along with the 6<sup>th</sup> graders (which do not have an in-school class) will meet following these guidelines for the fall semester: All 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>

grade students Mondays 3:30-4:30pm, Mens Ensemble TTB Tuesdays 3:30-4:30pm, and Ladies Ensemble Wednesdays 3:30-4:30pm, combined rehearsals of HS and MS choirs, on Thursdays. Friday may remain free providing attendance at the regular time is met.

Depending on the membership, this group will combine special times of the year for UIL group competitions and other judging events, and members may participate in outside UIL Region events on an individual basis through an audition process outlined by TMEA for Region participation.

Field trips will be scheduled for this group outside and during the school day. Continued Vocal training and performance will determine the curriculum.

A calendar of UIL, Texas Federation of Music Clubs, and the Texas Choir Directors Assn. events will be supplemental material with membership. A lab fee of \$30 for ensemble music, folder, and a uniform fee may apply.

# The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade and 9<sup>th</sup> through -12<sup>th</sup> Grade Choir Classes

These ensemble fine arts class is offered to high school students based on vocal technique, the desire to participate in a fine arts performance ensemble with requirements outlined by UIL and TMEA functions.

# **Course Objectives:**

- 1. Students will sing proficiently, alone and with others, a varied repertoire of music that is of an average difficulty level.
- 2. Students will compose or arrange short passages of music within specified guidelines.
- 3. Students will work in unity to produce a cohesive choral sound.
- 4. Students will be able to read and notate music given in class.
- 5. Students will listen to, analyze, and describe music using proper musical terminology.
- 6. Students will be able to articulate the relationship between music and other disciplines.
- 7. Students will describe music in relation to history and culture.

#### The Choir Classes will be:

Educating through UIL Participation in Concert and Sighteading in the Choir Educating through Individual Vocal Performance through UIL Solo and Ensemble Event and/or Texas Federation of Music Clubs Jr. Festival

Educating and providing Community and Local Opportunities through performance Offering Music Theory and Analysis, Studies in Foreign Language Development, Exposure to Significant High School and Secondary School Choir Groups through Judging events and field trips.

Providing Opportunity to Participate in Cross-Curriculum Events with Vocal Contribution, Theatrically and Artistically

Helping to Build Confidence for Leadership through Singing and Presentation Widening the Knowledge of All Vocal Styles, Group and Individual Offering Private Study, Camp Opportunities for Enrichment through TMEA events, All-

Working closely with Instrumental groups to build "College-Bound" All-Round Musicians.

\*\*Students must have forms on file for travel, medical information, blanket permission to publish, field trip consent, and parent acknowledgment of grading policy and class rules.

# ATTENDANCE/TARDY POLICY

State Clinics, etc.

It is essential that every choir member attend all rehearsals and be punctual. Regular tardiness will be addressed and will need a note from parent on file for the date late or missed. In the instance that Mrs. Ferris may have specially scheduled meetings or duty responsibilities, an adjusted calendar will be sent home with the members.

All Choir members and their families will try to communicate through Remind app. We depend on everyone to attend ALL rehearsals. If you are ill and miss school, you are excused from choir and should stay home and get well! A note or email stating the nature of the absence BEFORE it occurs, if possible, is appreciated.

During competition months special mandatory scheduled afterschool rehearsals may apply.

A supplemental handout for class requirements will accompany the Choir Handbook for detailed instruction requirements, letter-Jacket requirements, concerts, and yearly concert expectations. (Please see Addition to Choir Handbook, specifically outlining requirements for upper level choir musicians).

#### **BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS**

Choir members are expected to have good citizenship at all times; during the school day, during rehearsals and during performances. We will follow the Wortham Elementary and Middle School and High School Student Handbooks including \*Attentive Listening (no talking during rehearsals), \* Mutual Respect, \*Appreciations, \* No Put Downs", and \*Bulldog Best! Failure to follow these agreements may result in dismissal from the choir. Parents and students should keep both handbooks on file.

#### RESPONSIBILITY

Choir members are expected to turn in all necessary forms/permission slips, etc. within the first week of school term. There is a designated box in the music room for all choir related papers and information. Please **DO NOT** turn in choir forms to homeroom teachers! Choir members are also expected to wear the appropriate uniform for all choir performances. Students who are absent from choir practice are expected to find out what they missed. Choir "business" should be taken care of outside of your daily music time, preferably before or after school. #### **UNIFORM**

The standard uniform will once again consist of a Wortham Choirs polo/Tee rented annually by each member (and stored at the school) and dress **black** \*\***NEW** pants. Until a stricter uniform policy is adopted by the music clubs and/or choir boosters, parents should discuss styles with the director before purchasing, if possible. \*\*NTCC Members will need to purchase khaki pants to complete their uniform. All members will need to purchase a plain black belt to complete their uniform. Usually comfortable athletic shoes will complete the uniform. MS and HS students will need to purchase black performance shoes to wear with their slacks and shirts. Cost of uniform shirt varies, and definite costs will be relayed to the parents of each student during the ordering process.

High School and Middle School Concert dress may be required for Region, Honors Choir events. The student will be informed of uniform responsibility, accessories, etc. when notified of event. The choir program will work closely with the Choir Boosters Members for sizing, purchase, and maintenance of any uniform item.

## **Wortham High School Choir Policies and Procedures**

#### Classroom Policies – Mrs. Ferris

Choir is a course that seeks to give students in Wortham's High School experiences in the study and performance of a diverse repertoire of vocal/choral music. The course will include instruction in proper vocal technique, musicianship skills, and the cultural and historical context of choral literature. The course will encourage self-expression through performance and creation of music.

Class Description Curricular Music Class Materials for Class:

## Fees and Uniform Requirement:

Like Band, Choir Class is a Curricular Class providing teaching materials, performance supplies necessary for function in the class. The Wortham Choir Boosters Assn. is a functioning group that will assist in certain uniform purchases and some fees throughout the school term. There will be an initial fee of \$10 to join the Choir Boosters Assn. and a \$15/shirt fee. Other expenses throughout the year may include long dress khaki pants, black belt, and black performance shoes. A formal concert attire will require sizing, ordering, and upkeep, and will be maintained and stored in the choir Room

#### **CLASSROOM RULES**

- 1. Be at class and ready to start on time.
- 2. Leave all other business outside of the door and focus on working.
- 3. No eating, drinking, gum chewing, or cell phone use in class.
- 4. Be polite and respectful to teacher and students at all times.
- 5. Follow teacher's directions.
- 6. Participate and try your BEST. All must sing!
- 7. Follow all rules in student handbook.

#### Consequences for Continuous Disrespect for Rules:

Lots of verbal warnings, possible parent/student conferences,

Disappointment of the choir and its director for disruption and stop in progress.

Continued lack of participation and disrespect may lead to writing assignments as an alternative to vocal input.

Severe behavior results in immediate referral to office and possible expulsion from honor choir activities, festivals, and events. (i.e. Fighting, disrespecting teacher, stealing, etc.)

Conduct and Participation Grades are averaged weekly for choir students in class. There should be no behavior issues as Wortham Students of the choir class will be considered above all in discipline and representation of the school body. All will be expected to

participate in several projects, performance and academic assignments throughout the year. There will a semester project assigned, as well. Final grading is based on:

#### CHOIR GRADING POLICY

Grades will be based on students' participation in the classroom and at performances, written work, and quizzes.

A 20-point daily participation grade will be taken each day of class. In order to earn all 20 points, the student will be expected to actively participate and be attentive at all times.

All students are required to participate unless they have a doctor or parent note. If any student is too sick to sing, the director must be notified with a note from the nurse and/or parent at the beginning of the class period so that the student will earn a participation grade by attentively reading along with the music.

Students are expected to participate and put forth their best effort at all times. No participation equals a failing grade.

Grade Scale A = 90 - 100 B = 80 - 89 C = 70 - 79Failing = Below 70

#### **CONCERTS**

Two concerts will be held a year, a winter concert in December and a spring concert in May. Both concerts are mandatory, as they are included in grading for the current six weeks, fulfill the TEKS for Choir 1-1V and will be considered the semester exam. When uniform is not worn, standard dress code rules will apply. Absence will only be excused if the absence is due to illness, death in the family, or any other reason approved by the instructor.

# Field Trips and Performance Trips and Travel

#### **BUS TRIPS**

During the year, the Wortham All-Honors Choir or combination of choirs may travel out of town to events, games, or competitions. Moving 25-50 persons, uniforms, instruments, and equipment is not as easy job. To make this easier, strict rules of behavior will be enforced on the bus to avoid consequences.

When taking long bus trips, student assistants may be assigned for emergency exit evacuation, first aid supplies, equipment, trash duty, etc.

A seating chart is required by Texas law to accompany school groups on every trip.

Stay in your seat while the bus is moving is mandatory. This is STATE LAW, and failure to follow it can result in serious injury.

Obscene language/music and loud noise are not permitted.

There are no limits on personal stereos with headphones, as long as the student understands they must leave them on the bus at events, and are not secure.

Everyone is responsible for cleaning the trash out of the busses. Individuals may be assigned to assess bus clean-up.

For legal reasons, students who are non-choir members may not ride the bus without parent or legal guardian written permission, as well as consent of the director AND principal.

In keeping with school rules, ALL Choir MEMBERS MUST RIDE ON THE BUS TO AN EVENT. Any exceptions must be approved by the principal.

All parents/adult chaperones must submit two forms to the administration office to accompany students with the choir. You can find the forms on the Wortham ISD Webpage.

Every student must work to unload and load equipment for each performance trip.

Only a PARENT or LEGAL GUARDIAN can arrange for a student to leave the field trip and return home with other transporation. (Please note this does not say boyfriend/girlfriend, brother/sister) A written note must be on file with the director in this case.

Other situations must be approved by the director AND principal.

#### LOADING/UNLOADING

Again, everyone is expected to help unload the bus and equipment vehicles upon return from a trip. It is also EACH STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to load his/her own instrument, uniform, etc.

#### STUDENT REPONSIBILITY

It is the student's responsibility to report damaged equipment, inappropriate and abusive behavior on busses, and disrespect for materials on a trip. All out of town and out of state trips are considered a privilege through Wortham Schools and Wortham ISD, and behavior will be managed using the school's Code of Conduct.
